The Havhingsten Cable Has Landed

Though the vessel carrying the cable was delayed by poor weather towards the end of the week, Aqua Comms new fibre optic cable, spanning the Atlantic Ocean from New York arrived at Starr Gate on Sunday 11th.

When operational the cable, which is part of the North Atlantic Loop will provide the whole UK with super-fast new broadband and will eventually provide one third of the entire world's internet connection!

In addition to the contractors undertaking the works, there was a sizable film crew present.
